




Tribute to Harris Rosen



Harris Rosen, who built Florida's largest independent hotel chain, died at age 85.

In the early days. before his second hotel was built,

Florida Association of Nonprofits honored Harris Rosen with an award of distinction for the generous contributions of in-kind services and products he donated to the annual conference.

Frank Santos, VP of Rosen Hotels & Resorts characterized him as a beloved father, grandfather, and a pillar of our community with an unwavering commitment to help underserved communities, promote education, and support health and wellness.

Through his Foundation, Harris' philanthropy assisted local schools, healthcare, and other vital programs for underprivileged families.

Believing that it's the responsibility for the employers to provide healthcare, Mr. Rosen built an on-site clinic where staff pays \$800 annual premium with no deductibles.

"Education is one of the few things that can level the playing field", said Rosen, when he opened the Rosen College of Hospitality Management.

Missed by all who knew him, Rosen's legacy will live on through his actions and achievements.
